Total Population: 16,272 children were in the foster care system in Illinois on January 31, 2007ⁱ. Most children are placed temporarily in foster care due to parental abuse or neglect.

Length of Stay: The average length of stay for children in care on September 30, 2003 was 54 months.ⁱⁱ

Reunified: 40% of the young people leaving the system in FY 2003 were reunified with their birth parents or primary caregivers.ⁱⁱ

Foster Homes: In January 2007, there were a total of 13,692 licensed kinship and non-relative foster homes in Illinois.

On January 31, 2007, 38% of youth living in out-of-home care were residing with their relatives.ⁱ
